Evaluation

Three term tests and a final exam are scheduled. All are non-cumulative, multiple-choice tests based on both textbook and lecture material (including films and other demonstrations). Not all test material will be covered in class, and some test material covered in class will not be covered in the text, so regular attendance is important for success in this course. Note that you are responsible for all assigned readings from the text even if the specific content has not been covered in lectures. Many test questions will involve critical thinking, a skill you will be given practice developing in class, so again it's to your advantage to come to class.

Your course grade will be computed as the average of your best two in-term test marks and your final exam mark (33.3% each). Thus, you can do badly on one of the three tests (or miss one due to illness/emergency) but you must write two of the three tests as well as the final exam. Never miss a test unless it is absolutely necessary, since a subsequent illness/emergency could cause you to miss a second test. If you miss a second term test,

you must supply me with Physician/Counsellor Statement(s) indicating the basis for BOTH missed tests as soon as possible after the second missed test. Make things easy on everyone: do not miss more than one term test. At the instructor's discretion, a make-up exam may differ significantly (in form and/or content) from a regularly scheduled exam.

- 1. University of Calgary Core Competencies. Through this course, in addition to the course content detailed in this outline, you will be provided opportunities to observe and apply critical and creative thinking skills, to conduct analyses of problems within and beyond course material and be shown some of the skills needed to gather and organize information effectively. You will experience a small amount of the logical calculation and mathematical ability that underpins some of the sub-fields of Psychology. Further, as far as is possible in an survey course, you will have an opportunity to see and apply the abstract reasoning that supports developmental theories as well as the interpretive and assessment skills, and the insight and intuition that goes into generating knowledge in Developmental Psychology and in general.
- 2. Curriculum Redesign Features. The interdisciplinary location and aspects of Developmental Psychology will be regularly featured parts of the course. As well, international aspects of Developmental Psychological theory and discipline issues will be presented. While limited by the survey nature of the course you will, through class examples and suggested reflective exercises, see how development can be seen and studied experientially and how research fits directly into the material discussed and practiced in class.
